SUBJECT: MNC-I Policy #12 - Iraqi-Wide Installation Bar

1. References.

- a. 18 U.S.C Section 1382.
- b. Army Regulation 600-20, Army Command Policy. 13 May 2002.
- c. MCO 5510.15A, Security of Marine Corps Installation and Resources, 27 May 1993.

2. Purpose. This policy provides guidance regarding installation access across all operating bases within the jurisdiction of MNC-I for those persons who have been barred from individual installations within MNC-I due to misconduct.

3. Applicability. This policy applies to all United States service members, DoD civilian personnel, DoD contractor and subcontractor personnel, and all persons seeking access to MNC-I installations.

4. Policy. All persons who have been barred by an MNC-I installation commander from entering that commander's installation shall also be barred from entering all MNC-I installations for a period of one year from the date of the installation commander's bar letter. For US service members, this policy precludes unescorted access to MNC-I installations during the bar period even if the service member leaves military service and returns as a DoD civilian, contractor, or subcontractor.

a. Installation commanders who bar individuals from entering their installation shall:

(1) Forward one copy of the bar letter and the documents supporting the bar action to MNC-I PMO within 72 hours of the imposition of the bar. Electronic transmission of the letter and supporting documents is encouraged.

(2) Include the following paragraph in all bar letters:

"In accordance with MNC-I policy, you are barred from entering all MNC-I installations. You may appeal the bar from all MNC-I installations to the Chief of Staff, MNC-I. You may request limited access to one or more MNC-I installations from the Chief of Staff, MNC-I. However, the bar remains in effect while your appeal or limited access request is pending. You are authorized escorted access on MNC-I installations only as necessary to facilitate your departure from Iraq".

b. Escorted access to MNC-I installations for individuals barred from MNC-I installations in accordance with this policy is authorized only as necessary to facilitate the barred individual's departure from Iraq.

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c. Until theater-wide badging is fully implemented, MNC-I PMO shall maintain a master list of all persons barred from MNC-I installations and the date of expiration of the MNC-I installation bar. This list shall be maintained on the PMO web page on CENTRIXS. Camp mayors will ensure that lists are immediately available to all installation access control points. Once theater-wide badging is fully implemented, installations imposing bars will enter the bar information in the theater-wide badging database as a flagged record.

d. A listing of barred persons shall be made available to DoD contractors upon request.


e. Reconsideration and Appeals.

(1) Reconsideration. Individuals who have been barred by installation commanders from any MNC-I installation may request reconsideration of the bar from the commander who imposed the bar within one year of the imposition of the bar. Installation commanders who, after considering the request for reconsideration, choose to lift the installation bar will report same to MNC-I PMO within 72 hours of the decision to lift the bar.

(2) Appeal. Individuals who have been barred from MNC-I installations as the result of this policy may appeal the MNC-I bar to the Chief of Staff, MNC-I, as my designee. Individuals may request that the bar be overturned or may request exceptions to the MNC-I bar to access specific installations. An appeal may be submitted at any time within the one-year MNC-I installation bar period. Action by the Chief of Staff, MNC-I, is final and may not be appealed further.

f. For the purposes of this policy, an "installation commander" is any commander under Service regulations possessing the authority to order the removal from or prohibit the reentry of any person onto a military installation, base, camp, or station under the control of MNC-I.

5. Installation commanders who intend to bar civilian employees of the Department of Defense must first coordinate the bar with civilian personnel staff.
