Col. Considine retires from military service

ROCK Island, IL---Col. Timothy Considine, Deputy Commander, U.S. Army Field Support Command, Rock Island, Illinois, is retiring from the Army after 28 years of service on Feb. 28, 2005.

He is the son of Judith Snow, Muskogee, Oklahoma, formerly of Van Buren, Arkansas, and the late Raymond Considine. He is married to the former Rebecca Hart of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

He graduated from Van Buren High school in 1972 and the University of Arkansas in 1976 with a Bachelor of Science degree in public administration. After graduation, he received a commission into the Army Transportation Corps.

In 1984, he graduated from Florida Institute of Technology, where he earned a Master of Business Administration. His military education includes the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, the Transportation Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, and Joint forces Staff College.
