## Colonel Todd S. Bertulis Commander, 405th Army Field Support Brigade

Colonel Todd S. Bertulis assumed command of the 405th Army Field Support Brigade August 2014.

Col. Bertulis began his career in Korea where he served in the 227<sup>th</sup> Maintenance Battalion followed by a tour at Fort Bragg, NC, with the 782<sup>nd</sup> Main Support Battalion in the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division Support Command. Following the advanced course, he was assigned to Fort Hood, Texas where he served as a Brigade Plans Officer in the 64<sup>th</sup> Corps Support Group and Company Commander of the 565<sup>th</sup> Quartermaster Company. After command, he attended graduate school and then served as an assignment officer at U.S. Army Human Resources Command in Alexandria, Virginia.



Col. Bertulis was then assigned to the 589<sup>th</sup> Brigade Support Battalion, 4<sup>th</sup> Fires Brigade, 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division at Fort Hood, Texas. While serving as the Support Operations Officer, he deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) 05-07. Upon redeployment, he served as the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division Secretary of the General Staff and deployed in support of OIF 07-09. Following redeployment, he took command of the 204<sup>th</sup> Brigade Support Battalion, 2<sup>nd</sup> Brigade Combat Team at Fort Carson, CO. His command tour included a 12-month deployment in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. After command, he then served as the Assistant Executive Officer to the Commanding General, Army Materiel Command at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, before attending school in Washington, D.C.

His military education includes the Quartermaster Officer Basic Course, Combined Logistics Officer Advanced Course, Command and General Staff Officer Course, and Senior Service College at the Dwight D. Eisenhower School for National Security and Resource Strategy.

Col. Bertulis holds Master of Science Degrees in Logistics Management from the Air Force Institute of Technology and in National Resource Strategy from the National Defense University. His awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal (2 OLC), the Meritorious Service Medal (6 OLC), the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal (2 OLC), and the Parachutist Badge.
