Colonel Shane DeBusk assumed command of the 407th Army Field Support Brigade July 2014. He is a native of Elkton, Maryland. After serving four years in the Maryland Army National Guard as a Military Policeman, he was commissioned in the Quartermaster Corps upon graduation from Salisbury State University, Salisbury, Maryland in 1990.

COL DeBusk has served in a variety of assignments to include: Platoon Leader and Executive Officer, 574th Supply Company and Supply and Services Officer, 51st Maintenance Battalion, Mannheim, Germany; Plans Officer, 2d CMMC, Commander, 600th Quartermaster Company and S3, 264th Corps Support Battalion, 1st COSCOM, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Aide-de-Camp, Army and Air Force Exchange Service, Dallas, Texas; G4 Plans Officer 10th Mountain Division and Support Operations Officer and Executive Officer, 548th Corps Support Battalion, Fort Drum, New York and Concepts Officer in the Joint Staff J-4; Battalion Commander for the 264th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion where he deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. He was most recently assigned as the Aide de Camp to the Commander of Army Materiel Command and then as the Deputy, Depots and Arsenals Division.
