## **BRIGADIER GENERAL STEVEN J. FELDMANN DEPUTY COMMANDING GENERAL FOR OPERATIONS**

Brigadier General Feldmann serves as the Deputy Commanding General for Operations, Army Sustainment Command, a position he has held since October 2009. As the DCG-O, he is responsible for ASC operations throughout Central Commands Area of Operations, Contingency Operations and providing trained and ready U.S. Army Reserve Soldiers in support of worldwide mission requirements for the Army Materiel Command; the Defense Contract Management Agency; the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Acquisitions, Logistics, and Technology; the Logistics Civil Augmentation Program; the Defense Logistics Agency; and the Army Contracting Command. Prior to serving as the DCG-O, Brigadier General Feldmann served as Commander, 649th Regional Support Group, Cedar Rapids Iowa.

His overseas assignments include Haiti, where he served in a Joint Command as the AMC Commander for all logistics operations and requirements in support of Operation Unified Response; Afghanistan, where he served as the LOGCAP Deputy Program Director; and the Republic of South Korea, where he served as the Chief of Staff, 19th Theater Support Command (CONUS Augmentation).

Other key assignments held by Brigadier General Feldmann during his career include Director, Host Nation Support, 19th Theater Support Command (CONUS Augmentation); Mobilization Plans Officer, Headquarters, State Area Command; Commander, 234th Signal Battalion; Executive Officer, 334th Forward Support Battalion, 2nd Brigade, 34th Infantry Division; S3, 234th Signal Battalion; Executive Officer, 234th Signal Battalion; Commander, Company A, 234th Signal Battalion, 113th Support Group; and Platoon Leader and Executive Officer, Company C, 234th Signal Battalion, 113th Support Group , all located in cities throughout Iowa.

His military career began in 1973 with the U.S. Marine Corps, where he served until 1978. After a two-year break in service, he joined the Iowa Army National Guard. Upon graduation from the 185th Regiment (Regional Training Institute), formerly known as the Iowa Military Academy, he was commissioned as a Signal Corps Officer in 1984. He holds Bachelor of Arts Degrees in Criminal Justice Administration and Sociology from Mt. Mercy College, and a Masters Degree in National Security Strategy from the National War College. Brigadier General Feldmann's military education includes the Signal Basic and Advanced Courses; the Ordnance and Quartermaster Advance Courses; the Transportation Officer Qualification Course; the Combined Arms Staff Course; the United States Army Command and General Staff Course; and the National War College.

Brigadier General Feldmann's awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit; the Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters; the Bronze Star Medal; the Joint Commendation Medal; the Army Commendation Medal with four oak leaf clusters; the Army Achievement Medal with three oak leaf clusters; the Marine Corps Good Conduct Medal, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal with seven oak leaf clusters; the Afghanistan Campaign Medal; the Humanitarian Service Medal, and the NCO Professional Development Ribbon with Numeral 3.

Brigadier General Feldmann, a native of Hopkinton, Iowa, is a Lieutenant with the Cedar Rapids Police Department. He and Jane have three children; Lynsey, Sgt. Adam Feldmann, and Nathaniel.
