## **Colonel Aaron Stanek Commander – 401st Army Field Support Brigade**

Colonel Aaron Stanek assumed the duties as Commander of the 401<sup>st</sup> Field Support Brigade June 2016. He received his commission in 1993 through the Army Reserve Officers Training Program at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

As a company grade officer, he served in the 324th, Forward Support Battalion, Ft Benning, GA and later commanded the 23d Ordnance Company (Ammo), Miesau Army Depot, Germany. As a Major, he served as the G3, Deputy Chief of Operations, for the Headquarters, 1st Corps Support Command (Airborne), 18<sup>th</sup> Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg, NC. In this capacity, he participated in OPERATION, IRAQI FREEDOM from 2004-2005. Upon redeployment from OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM, in 2005 Colonel Stanek was assigned to the United States Army Special Operations Command (USASOC), Ft Bragg, NC where he served as the 528th Special Operations Sustainment Brigade S4 and Support Operations Officer (SPO), and later 3d Special Forces Group, 3d Group Support Battalion SPO, where he deployed in support of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM from 2007-2008. Upon redeployment from Afghanistan in 2008, Colonel Stanek served in the USASOC G4, and then as HQs Commandant, Special Operations Command Central from 2009-2010, MacDill AFB, FL.



As a Lieutenant Colonel, he returned to Fort Bragg, NC and established command of the Army Materiel Command, Army Field Support Battalion Bragg and served as Battalion Commander from 2010-2012. Upon completion of command, Colonel Stanek served as United States Army Special Forces Command (Airborne), Assistant Chief of Staff, G4 until 2013 when he attended Senior Service College at the National War College, Ft. McNair, Washington, D.C. After the senior service college, Colonel Stanek was assigned to the Pentagon, The Joint Staff, Directorate of Logistics, J4, as the Deputy Division Chief for the Strategy and Readiness Division. Colonel Stanek earned a Master's Degree in Logistics and National Security Strategy from the Florida Institute of Technology and National Defense University in 2003, and 2014 respectively.

Colonel Stanek is married they have two children.
