Director, Directorates of Logistics

Kathy Acree serves as director of the Directorates of Logistics (DOL) Enterprise realignment initiative. In that position, she leads the realignment of maintenance, supply, ammunition, transportation, food service, and other support service functions from the U.S. Army Installation Management Command (IMCOM) to ASC. The functions transferring to ASC encompass 53 maintenance facilities and 184 supply activities located at 77 domestic and overseas locations. These DOL facilities are responsible for a budget of over \$2 billion and a workforce of approximately 7,600 civilian and contractor employees.

Other leadership positions held at ASC by Ms. Acree during her career include Deputy to the Commander at the 402nd Army Field Support Brigade in Iraq; Deputy for Resource Management (G8); Deputy for Field Support; and Deputy for Logistics (G4).

Earlier, Ms. Acree held a variety of positions at the Tank-automotive and Armaments Command (TACOM) at Rock Island Arsenal, as chief of the Bradley Armaments Group; senior command representative at AMC's Logistics Support Element in Iraq; chief of the Asset Management Group; chief of the Planning, Development and Programs Office; chief of the Policy, Plans, and Programs Division; and team leader for the Major Item Product Line and the Business Management Resource Office. She also served as lead action officer for the Ammunition Product Line and principal advisor to the Executive Deputy for Logistics Readiness

Other assignments held by Ms. Acree during her career include: Headquarters, U.S. Army Combat Equipment Group, Europe; Headquarters, 2d Signal Brigade in Mannheim, Germany; Headquarters, Fifth US Army in San Antonio, Texas; Headquarters, Fort Sam Houston, Texas; and the U.S. Army Troop Support and Aviation Command in St. Louis.

Ms. Acree holds an Associates Degree in Accounting; a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Management from University of Maryland; and a Masters Degree in Education (Human Resources) from Boston University.
