Sergeant Major Danette Bailey Sergeant Major, Army Field Support Battalion-Qatar

Sergeant Major Danette Davis Bailey was born in Richmond, VA and raised in Petersburg, VA. In 1981, she entered the United States Army Reserve Delayed Entry Program.

Throughout her 34 year career, Sergeant Major Bailey served in numerous positions and leadership roles. Her first assignment was with the 300th Area Support Group, where she served as a Food Service Specialist for Return of Forces to Germany.

Sergeant Major Bailey transitioned into the Total Army School System community; holding positions as Primary Instructor, Program of Instruction Writer, Course Manager, and Regional Director with the Quartermaster Corps. She held distinctive leadership positions at section, platoon, company, and battalion levels beyond her pay grade. In 2003 — 2004, she was mobilized to Fort Lee, VA as the primary instructor to provide Quartermaster training and Military Occupational Specialties re-classification for the 80th Division. She later taught Advanced Individual Training Soldiers for the Active Duty element. A veteran of Operation Iraqi Freedom, she was deployed as the 247th Combat Support Battalion's First Sergeant, Camp Arifjan, Kuwait. Sergeant Major Bailey was selected as the G7 Operations Sergeant Major for the 80th Training Command to oversee training requirements for over 40,000 military members to include Active Duty, Reservists, and National Guardsmen on a yearly rotation cycle. She also served as the Command Sergeant Major, 3-401st Army Field Support Battalion, Bagram, Afghanistan from 2012 — 2013.



In addition, she served as the G4 Sergeant Major for US Army Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations Command (USACAPOC) Airborne, Fort Bragg, NC. Prior to being called to active duty in April 2015, she was the S3 Operations Sergeant Major, 1st Training Brigade, USACAPOC, Fort Bragg, NC.

In 2003, she entered the General Service (GS) system as a Unit Administrator. Since then, she has held various positions of high operational tempo in the Fort Lee and Richmond, VA areas. Serving in the grade of GS-11, she is the Civilian Personnel Officer for the 80th Training Command, which is inclusive to more than 6,000 Soldiers, Department of the Army employees, and contractors.

Sergeant Major Bailey is a graduate of the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy, Class 01-09. Sergeant Major Bailey attended Smithdeal Massey Business College and John Tyler Community College in Chester, VA.
