

SCHOOL BUS RULES

1. Students will be courteous, not use profane language or be excessively noisy.
2. Students will not eat or drink on the bus. Help keep the bus clean by using the wastebasket.
3. Students will obey the bus driver and bus monitor.
4. Students will not fight on the bus. Parents will be held financially responsible for damage done to the bus by their child.
5. Students will not smoke, chew tobacco or spit on the floor.
6. Students will not be destructive to the bus, or the belongings of others.
7. Students will stay in their seats. They will not stand in the aisles, crawl under or climb on the seats.
8. Students will keep their head, hands and feet inside the bus.
9. Students will not throw anything out the windows.
10. Students will be ready for the bus at least 5 minutes before the scheduled bus stop time to help keep the bus on schedule.
11. Students will keep books, coats and other objects out of the aisles.
12. Students will be alert and cautious when crossing in front of the school bus.
13. Students will not bring animals on the school bus.
14. Students will contact the Contractor if they are not riding the bus to or from school.
15. If your child has seizures or health problems, you should provide the bus office with instructions on how to care for your child in an emergency.
16. Do not send medication on the bus. Children are not allowed to have any medication in their possession while on the bus.
17. Parents (adult babysitter) of pre-school children and physically handicapped children must be present to put the child on and take the child off the school bus.

18. Portable radios, CD/MP3 players, cell phones or other electronic devices must not be distracting to the driver or others. Students will be required to turn them off or put them away if required by the driver or monitor.

19. **CHILDREN MUST BE ABSOLUTELY QUIET WHEN THE BUS IS APPROACHING AND CROSSING THE RAILROAD TRACKS.**



School Bus Safety Tips for Parents

Getting Ready for School

- ✓ Have your children put everything they carry in a backpack or school bag so that they won't drop things along the way.
- ✓ Have them wear bright, contrasting colors so they will be more easily seen by drivers.
- ✓ Make sure they leave home on time so they can walk to the bus stop and arrive before the bus is due. Running can be dangerous.

Walking to the Bus Stop

- ✓ Walk your young child to the bus stop and have older children walk in groups. There is safety in numbers; groups are easier for drivers to see.
- ✓ Practice good pedestrian behavior: walk on the sidewalk, if there is no sidewalk, stay out of the street.
- ✓ If you must walk in the street, walk single file, face traffic and stay as close to the edge of the road as you can.
- ✓ Stop and look left, right and then left again if you must cross the street. Do the same thing at driveways and alleys. Exaggerate your head turns and narrate your actions so your child knows you are looking left, right and left.

Waiting at the Bus Stop

- ✓ Don't let your child play running games or push and shove at the bus stop. It is dangerous near traffic.
- ✓ Make sure your child stands at least 10 feet (5 giant steps) from the road while waiting for the bus. The child will then be out of the way of traffic. Have younger children practice taking 5 giant steps to become familiar with 10 feet.

Getting On and Off the Bus

- ✓ Warn children that, if they drop something, they should never pick it up. Instead, they should tell the driver and follow the driver's instructions. If they bend over to pick up a dropped object, they might not be seen by the driver and could be hurt if the driver pulls away from the stop.
- ✓ Remind children to look to the right before they step off the bus. Drivers in a hurry sometimes try to sneak by busses on the right.
- ✓ Teach your children to secure loose drawstrings and other objects that may get caught in the handrail or door of the bus as they are exiting.
- ✓ Give your child a note or follow your school's procedures if you would like for the child to get off at a stop other than the one they are assigned. The driver isn't allowed to let a child off at another stop without written permission.
- ✓ If you meet your child at the bus stop after school, wait on the side where the child will be dropped off, not across the street. Children can be so excited at seeing you after school that they dash across the street and forget the safety rules.

Riding the Bus

- ✓ Children should talk quietly, be courteous to the driver and follow the driver's instructions.
- ✓ Children should stay seated during the entire bus ride and keep the aisles clear.
