D. Scott Welker was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in October 2005 into the position of Deputy to the Commander, U.S. Army Sustainment Command, Rock Island, Illinois. As Deputy to the Commander, Mr. Welker leads and directs the Command's global logistics mission, which comprises a workforce of approximately 340 military personnel, 2,200 civilian employees, and over 75,000 contractor and Host Nation employees. The Command links national capabilities to the Soldier, Integrates and synchronizes materiel distribution and provides logistics solutions to enable unit readiness. It's core mission includes the integration of Acquisition, Logistics and Technology support to Army tactical and operational forces. Mr. Welker is responsible for a diverse and global organization spread across seven Army Field Support Brigades that encompasses the logistical synchronization of unit pre-deployment, deployment, sustainment, re-deployment, and field level reset in support of each pool of Army Force Generation. He further oversees the execution of the Army Prepositioned Stocks program, providing Materiel Management and readiness support for Continental United States Army forces, executing the Army's Lead Materiel Integration mission, the Left Behind Equipment mission, the Pre-Deployment Training Equipment program, the Theatre Provided Equipment accountability program, the Army's Logistics Assistance Program, operations of installation based Directorates of Logistics, and the program management responsibilities of the Army's Logistics Civil Augmentation Program.
