



Materiel Readiness Training (MRTD)

Frequently Asked Questions

Q-What types of Automated Logistics Training does MRTD provide:

Decision Support Tool - Sourcing Module (DST-SM). Decision Support Tool - Sourcing Module is the Army's tool for equipment distribution/redistribution management. It receives legacy/ERP data from AESIP. DST merges authorizations, equipment on hand, and inventory over time to enable effective decision making.

Strategic Support Area Business Reporting Environment tool (SABRE) Supply Management Army (SMA). The Supply Management Army Metrics is part of the SABRE Viz suite and provides operational and strategic views of logistics supply chain information. SMA Metrics includes visualizations such as Composite Readiness, Supply Availability, Inventory Turns, and Sales Plan data useful for supply chain logisticians at AMC/LCMC level.

Strategic Support Area Business Reporting Environment tool (SABRE) Organic Industrial Base (OIB). The Organic Industrial Base Metrics capability is part of the SABRE Viz suite and provides operational and strategic views of supply chain, resources, and performance information across the Army's Organic Industrial Base (depots, arsenals, ammunition activities). OIB Metrics includes visualizations such as Revenue, Expenses, and Efficiency; New and Unfilled Orders; Schedule Churn; and Performance to Promise metrics useful for AMC, MSC, and OIB logisticians.

Theater Provided Equipment (TPE). Users navigate through the Theater Provided Equipment Management process using LMI-DST. This includes users at the unit, theatre, ARCENT and Item Managers. It provides a walk-through with tool and step by step instructions for the various tasks related to TPE management.

Decision Support Tool Unit Reset Planner (URP). Users view, claim and execute plans for reset and to maintain accurate visibility over equipment repair, replacement, recapitalization and expenditures in order to sustain equipment availability and meet operational requirements.

Q-How is training presented?

A-In-person (face to face) training, your personnel can come to our location (Redstone Arsenal) or we can travel to your location (your organization must fund our instructor's TDY Cost). On-line/virtual training sessions via Teams (no cost to your organization).

Q- How long are your on-line/virtual training sessions?

A-All on-line session are 1/2 days however, the number of days depends on the type of training you're requesting (DST-4 days, SABRE SMA-2 days, URP-1-day, etc.).

Q-How long are your in-person training sessions?

A-All in-person session are full days however, the number of days depends on the type of training you're requesting (DST-3 days, SABRE SMA-1 days, URP-1-day, etc.).

Q-What platforms will I need access to for training?

A-You will need access to Army Enterprise Portal (AESIP) (with enterprise basic roles (with-in AESIP)), Blackboard, and TEAMS (for on-line only).

Q-Do I need to complete multiple MRTD Training Request Forms when requesting multiple training sessions?

A-Yes, you will need to complete one MRTD Training Request Form for each training session (example: complete one request form, for a 4-day block of DST session and another request form for a 1-day URP session).

Q-Is there a class maximum size limit?

A-We ask that you limit your class size to a maximum of 50 students.

Q- Is there a class minimum size?

A-We ask that your class size is a minimum of 5 students.

Q-Is it possible for us to request dates and confirm dates with MRTD before we submit our student rosters?

A-Yes, you can submit your MRTD Training Request Form (to lock in your requested date) and then submit your Student Roster later (please include approximant number of students on your request form).

Q-Can contractors (supporting Army organizations) attend training session?

A-Yes, contractors can attend training sessions.

Q-Is there funding associated with attending training?

A-There is no cost for online training however, there is TDY cost associated with In-person (face to face) training sessions.
