AFSBN-Korea serves as the Army Materiel Command's (AMC) "Face to the Warfighter" for 2ID, USAG Yongsan Casey and USAG Humphreys. Its mission includes assisting with sustaining the highest operational equipment readiness rates, new equipment and materiel fielding and training, integration of Life Cycle Management Commands (LCMCs); and the integration of acquisition, logistics, and technology to support Soldier requirements.

Headquartered at Camp Humphreys, Pyeongtaek, South Korea, the AFSBN-Korea is a mission-focused and modular unit organized to project logistics power forward to every element of our expeditionary Army. AFSBN Korea is a subordinate element of the 403d AFSB, headquartered at Camp Henry, Daegu, South Korea. The AFSBN-Korea focuses on operational readiness of US Army units operating on the Korean peninsula and Japan.

AFSBN-Korea team is the sole field level Headquarters where all AMC LCMCs and Army Sustainment Command (ASC) representatives operate as a single entity. The AMC LCMCs are Aviation and Missile Command (AMCOM), Communications and Electronics Command (CECOM), Joint Munitions Command (JMC) and Tank-Automotive and Armaments Command (TACOM). Each LCMC is represented by Logistics Assistance Representatives (LARs) embedded within AFSBN-Korea. The LAR credo of "Teach, Coach, Mentor and Train" has a direct impact on preparedness for contingency and wartime operations. Additionally, ASC employees assist supported units by providing linkage to strategic supply and maintenance systems.

AFSBN-Korea is responsible for the Installation Supply, Maintenance, and Transportation missions for USAG Yongsan-Casey and USAG Humphreys. Maintenance functions include maintaining AMC's non-tactical vehicles along with Garrison-owned tactical equipment. Supply functions include Central Issue Facility, Food Service/Supply Subsistence Management Office, Hazardous Materiel Control Point, and Installation Property Book Office. Transportation functions include, Transportation Motor Pool, Shuttle Bus mission, Personal Property Processing Office, Personal Property Shipping Office, Commercial Travel Office, and the Vehicle Processing Center.

### TIMELINE & HISTORY

AFSBN-Korea traces its lineage to the early 1980s with the establishment of the Logistics Assistance Office (LAO) for 2ID at Camp Casey.

In 1995, LAO-2ID was renamed Logistics Support Element (LSE)-2ID.

In 2000, LAO-2ID was assigned responsibilities for all LARs in the 2ID footprint.

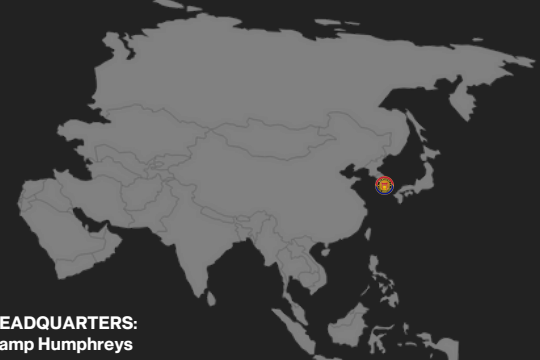
In June 2009, the unit was redesignated AFSBN-2ID.


In May 2011, the unit was redesignated AFSBN-Korea, based on geographical location.

In March 2015, AFSBN-Korea merged with Logistics Readiness Center (LRC) Red Cloud establishing a single face to the field.

In 2016, the battalion and LRC split their efforts once again.

In 2018, AFSBN-Korea moved to Camp Humphreys and merged with LRC Humphreys.
