Colonel Timothy J. Fenlason assumed the duties as commander, Army Sustainment Command-Army Reserve Element in November of 2016.

COL Fenlason was commissioned in May 1989 as an Armor officer and attended the Armor Officer Basic Course and Scout Platoon Leader course before being assigned to the 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment in Germany. While in 2nd ACR, he deployed to Southwest Asia to Desert Storm, Desert Shield and Provide Comfort as a Tank Platoon Leader. He returned to Germany and served as a Scout Platoon Leader and Adjutant before reassignment to 11th ACR as a Regimental Liaison Officer, Regimental Training Officer and Troop Executive Officer.



COL Fenlason left active duty in 1994 and joined the Army Reserve in 1995 while living in Germany as a civilian, facilitating deployments in support of missions to Bosnia. While in the USAR in Germany, he served as Base Defense Liaison Team Officer, Detachment Executive Officer and Combat Plans Officer, all as part of the 7th Army Reserve Command in Schwetzingen.

He returned to the United States in 1998 and has served as Platoon Leader Observer/Controller, Team Chief, Company Commander, Adjutant, Battalion Commander, Secretary General Staff, Garrison Commander, Deputy Chief of Staff – G4 and Exercise Branch Chief for various units in seven states.

COL Fenlason has a Bachelor of Architecture professional degree from Wentworth Institute of Technology in Boston and is a graduate of the Equal Opportunity Leaders Course, the Joint Readiness Training Center Observer Controller Course, the Transportation Officer Advanced Course, Combined Arms and Services Staff School and Command and General Staff College.
